DAVID DELIVERING THE M6 LINK

David Morris MP is bringing £123 million of investment to construct the M6 Link Road

In 2010 the Conservative **Secretary of State for Transport Phillip Hammond** MP announced that the **Government would invest** £111 million to build the Heysham M6 Link Road.

The County Council also made a commitment to fund the remaining £12 million bringing the total to £123 million. David Morris MP and Transport Minister Mike Penning MP relayed the announcement to the waiting press at Junction 34 of the M6. Mike Penning made the point

that David Morris had mentioned the M6 Link road to Transport Ministers every day since he was elected.

Construction of the link road is due to begin later this year. When the road is completed, it will be the economic backbone of the region. No longer will HGV's travelling to the port have to queue for a considerable period of time in Lancaster and no longer will those who do business in Morecambe & Lunesdale need to wait for hours in traffic jams. The Heysham M6 Link road will connect the Port to the M6 and will link Morecambe &

Lunesdale to the national transport

A recent report suggested that for every £1 invested in the M6 Link Road. £6 will be earned for the economy. There will also be 3,000 people employed during the construction of the road, with opportunities for unemployed people to train because a minimum of 100 local unemployed people will receive training and jobs during construction.

David Morris MP said, "I am proud to have secured this investment for the area, it will bring much needed jobs, in fact one of the contractual obligations imposed on the building firm Costain is that they have to employ apprentices. This means there will be employment opportunities for our young people to train. The road will kick start the local economy and I am excited that it is being built."



Recently the Port of Heysham's owners invested £10 Million with a further £5 Million earmarked for infrastructure improvement projects.

David Campaigns for EU Referendum

European Union red tape affects nearly every aspect of our everyday life. This is making it difficult for local businesses to operate within the law with so many unnecessary laws emanating from the unaccountable Commission in Brussels.

The original Common Market has grown from a trade organisation to an organisation that impacts heavily on daily life. David believes you should be able to decide whether



the UK remains a member of the EU or whether the UK should terminate its membership. That is why David is currently working with Parliamentary colleague James Wharton MP on the EU Referendum Bill. David tabled his own Parliamentary motion in support of Mr. Wharton's Bill.

David said, "So many constituents contact me about how disillusioned they have become with the European Union. It is imperative we listen to those constituents. That is why I support a referendum. A referendum is the only fair way to determine if we should leave the Union or remain a part of it. The EU

has introduced unnecessary health and safety laws and they even attempted to ban olive oil dipping bowls until I said enough is enough and they dropped that particular piece of red tape."

For every £1 invested in the Heysham M6
Link Road the region will earn £6. The M6 link road will create 3000 jobs including 100 jobs for unemployed people and apprenticeship opportunities for young people.





David Morris MP has successfully campaigned against onshore wind farms at Claughton Moor and Heysham. Unfortunately as quickly as David fights off these applications, determined energy companies reapply. David has now secured a change in planning guidelines.

Previously onshore wind application decisions were not always reflecting the views and feelings of local residents: the very people who have to look at the monstrosities. The new planning guidance that David Morris has secured will make it clear that the need for renewable energy does not

automatically override environmental protections and the concerns of local communities, giving greater weight to landscape and visual impact concerns. This means that if the local community want to object to ten turbines being built at Claughton Moor they will be listened to.

we were relying on luck rather than any defined planning process and now that has changed. When you consider that all of the onshore wind farms in the Country generate less power than Heysham 1 & 2 our communities should not have to put up with them."
